Your Parish Council met on 11th February and for the second month running there were no planning applications to consider.

Under the heading for correspondence there were various items and these included the following;

- There was a letter from the Ministry of Justice confirming that the Diocese had applied for the closure of the Sellindge Churchyard. What will happen now is that once the closure has taken place your Parish Council will maintain it in perpetuity. It is envisaged that an area will be set aside for nature and as mentioned in a newsletter last year.
 - Once the daffodils have died back a good clearance will take place making sure that the rubbish is removed.
- All Town and Parish Councils have been invited to send a representative to the Canterbury Cathedral where they will host Kent's Civic Service on Tuesday 17th March at 11am. Cllr Fursdon expressed an interest in attending.
- The A20 Hythe Road, Mersham is to be closed on Monday 24th February between 11pm & 6am Tuesday 25th February.

The casual vacancy that has arisen since Chris Mason's resignation has now been advertised and should you be interested then please do contact the office to find out more.

The Parish Council Office will be closing for the first two weeks of March as there is to be a replacement porta cabin being sited where the present porta cabin is. There will also be no phones available, so if you need to contact the Parish Council urgently during this time contact the Parish Council Chairman, Mr Stanley Bull on 07710 260 751. Your Parish Council have been able to purchase some saplings (young trees) and these will be delivered in time to plant before the end of the season.

The next meeting of your Parish Council will be on 10th March, it is hoped that by then your Parish Council will have had some suggestions on what residents would like to see happen on 75th VE day. So, if you know of any event happening in the village and believe your Parish Council could assist with covering some of the costs do attend and find out.

We both attended the Parish Council meeting on 11 February where we updated the Parish Council on the matters below and answered questions.

There's important news about the Otterpool Park Garden Town project. On 06 February the District Council bought the land held by Cozumel Estates its private sector partner in the Otterpool Park project. The purchase includes the former Folkestone Racecourse and several houses, a total of approximately 200 acres as well as the options to buy neighbouring farmland of a further 440 acres. The purchase price was £25m. This means the District Council is now the major landowner for Otterpool Park. Homes England, the Government agency that funds affordable housing bought land in the Otterpool area in 2018 and will continue as a partner in delivering the new homes, employment sites and community facilities.

The Government has been very supportive of the plans for Otterpool Park providing grants towards the planning costs. On 14 January it announced a further grant towards Otterpool Park of £580,000 (the single largest grant made from a £6m fund specifically for the creation of garden communities across the country). You can find more information about Otterpool Park at www.otterpoolpark.org and we are both happy to discuss this project (or any other District Council matter) with residents.

In other District Council news, David Monk, the Leader of the Council has invited the leaders of each of the opposition groups to join the Council's Cabinet. As far as we know, this is a unique arrangement for a Council and so far only the Greens and Liberal Democrats have accepted. It is hoped this will provide stability for the Council. You may have noticed a new development by Pentland Homes off Stone Street in Stelling Minnis. This was the site of a derelict egg factory and now has a mix of 2-, 3- and 4-bedroom houses. Nine of the 2- and 3-bedroom houses are eligible for shared ownership – a great way for those who can't afford a house on the open market to get on the housing ladder. Jenny attended the Governors' Meeting at Sellindge Primary School on 22 January and visited during the SATs practice tests on 30 January. She was at the Sellindge Surgery Patients Participation Group on 30 January and went to the Sports & Social Club meeting on 10 February. Jenny also attended the launch of the Stanford Parish history book on 25 January a project we both supported with a ward grant.

February is always a busy month at Kent County Council as it's when we set our annual budget. KCC provides over 300 services many of which you are unlikely to notice unless they disappeared. The emergency response provided by Kent Highways is an obvious example with our officers out over Christmas to deal with flooding and coping with fallen trees during Storm Ciara (over 500 emergency calls handled over the weekend of the storm). Our budget meeting was on 13 February and lasted all day. Papers and webcast are available on www.kent.gov.uk KCC will be spending over £1 billion on essential day to day services, an increase of £77 million (7.8%) over 2019/20. This is the largest increase in 10 years and is the first time KCC has seen an increase in grants from Central Government in that time. Much of the increase will be spent on services to the vulnerable (disabled children, child protection, residential care for older people and those with learning disabilities) and more on our highways. For a Band D household the Council Tax increase of just under 4% (half for normal expenditure and half ringfenced for social care) equates to a £1 increase a week for a Band D home for the KCC element of your Council Tax. I am sure that like me you have noticed plenty of potholes and blocked drains (gullies) on our roads. Please report them. The best way to do this is online at www.kent.gov.uk and then go to the highways section of the website. If there is an immediate danger to life ring Kent Police on 999, if it is urgent then ring 0300 41 91 91 and in all cases of reporting to KCC make a note of the reference number in case the matter needs chasing. If you don't have internet access then you can ring 0300 41 81 81 in office hours for non-urgent reports – such repairs are normally carried out within 28 days. Despite the bad weather, the running total of Highway repairs in our district since 01 January 2019 is 920 potholes filled and 689 square metres of patching to cover multiple holes. There will be more crews out making repairs as the weather improves.

One of the best parts of being a County Councillor is being at events where success is celebrated and meeting people who have done something special. The 25th annual Spirit of Tryangle Awards for Kent's young people held on 09 February in Ashford was just such an occasion with over 40 finalists each with an inspiring story about achievement, service, bravery and perseverance. I presented the awards for Personal Development and wish you could have all been with me to enjoy seeing so many young people doing so much good.

There's a consultation I'd like to draw to your attention. This one is not from KCC but Highways England about the Lower Thames Crossing. You may wonder what this has to do with us but it is really important as this project should provide the right infrastructure for the road freight traffic between the Midlands and the Channel Ports and avoid the majority of it using the M20. Sellindge & District Playing Fields Benevolent Society (Sellindge Sports & Social Club) was founded in 1967 by the local community for Sellindge & District residents and is run by a Committee of Volunteers. It is financed by Membership Fees, Club Rents, Franchising of the bar, rent from the flat and fundraising events eg Boot Fairs, Bonfire Night etc. Bids are also submitted for grants when appropriate, eg for the development of the Children's Play Area and the resurfacing of the car park. The next major cost is the resurfacing of the Tennis Courts where we are also looking to see if they could be used as a MUGA (Multi Use Games Area). Other activities include Football, Tennis, Bowls, Whist, Bingo, Darts, Pool, Crib and a range of one-off activities. There is also a function room and there is a Carvery every Sunday. Membership runs from 1 January-31 December and we would encourage residents to become Members at a cost of only £5 per year (over 16) whether or not you are a regular user.

It is with great sadness that by the time you read this, I will have attended the funeral of my sister-in-law Margaret Birch, so soon after my brother Richard's in November 2019. In the early days when a Steward was employed, she dealt with all the day to day running of the bar, including stocktaking, ordering, weekly reconciliation of sales and stock etc. Richard & Margaret were instrumental in setting-up the Bonfire Nights and Margaret was often seen at the Boot Fairs collecting donations. Margaret will be a very hard act to follow and we are grateful for all her input over many years.

Once, a young teacher read a note attached to some fresh green ivy: "Because of the seeds you planted, we will one day grow into beautiful plants like this one. We appreciate all you've done for us. Thank you for investing time in our lives." The ivy plant represented a gift of love. (Adapted from 'In the Garden with God', Eagle, 2000). Churches are always dependent on gifts of love. Gifts of time or money are an expression of gratitude and thanksgiving towards God, or to keep the local Church alive and transform its future.

About 45% of all Grade I buildings in England are Churches. Though first and foremost a place of worship, Churches are also often the oldest building in a settlement still in continual use. In some places today Churches are the last community building left open when pubs, post offices, shops and even village halls close. Many visitors come to search for previous generations in their family history and to explore the history of the buildings and their place in the story of the communities in which they have stood for centuries. Churches are also a place to find a quiet oasis away from the busy world.
