So, the regular monthly meeting of your Parish Council took place on March 10th, with the regular headings.

Under planning

At the meeting an application for development was mentioned; I say 'mentioned' as this is by no means written in stone and was for information only. The application is for land West of the Taylor Wimpey Development that is already being built. The company is called Gladman Development Ltd and they wish to build 55 houses.

Originally there was to be a public consultation being held on 25th March, however, due to the current situation regarding the Coronavirus this will not now take place.

Your Parish Council is waiting for information to arrive that will be made available on the Parish Council Website.

If you do not have access to this, then you are welcome to contact the Chairman on 07710 260 751 and he will contact the Clerk on the matter, as due to the Covid-19 the Parish Council office is closed.

There had been an application for tree works to take place on a Tree with a preservation order on it and your Parish Council objected to the works being carried out; they felt that the reasons for wanting it removed had not been explained enough and wanted more details. However, it was also noted that this application had been refused. The Glebe Farm application had gone appeal, due to the District Council not coming to a decision, your Parish Council had strongly objected to the application. The Planning Inspector has now been, and refused the application. Parish Councillors requested three items for the future Parish Council meeting, but now that this is not taking place, most will have to be considered by email.

At the meeting your Parish Councillors decided that the Annual Assembly would be held on 25th May this year, but now due to the current situation it is not known if this will take place; your Parish Council will confirm this a later date depending on the advice of the Government.

With each and every one of us being encouraged to stay indoors, there will be no deliveries of the Village News.

It is available on line – for those who have the internet – copies are going to be left in the Co-op for those who don't. You can still contact Your Parish Council by email, or phone the Chairman 07710 260 751. I understand that he has agreed to supply dog poo bags. The correct procedure is to phone him and he will leave them on his wall at the bottom of his garden to maintain the 2 metres distance between people.

Due to Covid-19 restrictions there will be no Parish Council meeting until further notice.

Since starting this report, Covid-19 has changed this and there was no exhibition. I have been in touch with Gladman Ltd asking if they could either a) extend their consultation date, or b) stop the consultation altogether. Whether they accommodate the wishes of your Parish Council is yet to be seen, but the District Council is aware of the proposed development and so we are now working together to try and prevent things moving forward prior to the Planning Inspectorate's public inspection of the plan.

DISTRICT and COUNTY COUNCILLORS' REPORT SELLINDGE APRIL 2020

The situation with coronavirus (Covid 19) has moved very rapidly and for the most up to date information it is best to look online (at official gov.uk and nhs.uk sites) or listen to local radio. Both your District and County Council have business continuity plans to ensure that key services are still delivered (particularly to the most vulnerable). As a community we are sure that villagers will be looking out for their neighbours.

Many people do want to help with more than 500,000 signing up to the NHS volunteer scheme within the first 24 hours of it being announced. There are three ways the NHS volunteers are being asked to help and you can volunteer for one or all three. The first is to contact people by phone to check they are ok and chat with them. The second is delivering food and/or medications in the immediate vicinity (generally no more than a 20-mile radius in country areas and 5 miles in urban). The third is driving home those who have been discharged from hospital. Volunteers must be 18 or over and fit and well with no symptoms. Those in higher-risk groups (including those over 70, those who are pregnant or with underlying medical conditions) will be able to offer support by telephone.

You can also volunteer locally through one of the three hubs your District Council has set up to cover the whole District. Sellindge and surrounding area is served from Hythe on 01303 269 602 and email Covid-19@ageukhl.org.uk You can use these contact details to both ask for help and volunteer to help and they will be open 7 days a week from 9am to 4pm. Alternatively you can also contact the Folkestone & Hythe Covid-19 number 01303 761 116 or email Covid-19@folkestone-hythe.gov.uk and these will be staffed 7 days a week from 9am – 5pm.

Those receiving care arranged by KCC should continue to do so with contingency arrangements in place should care providers need help covering vacancies.

The District Council has been making special arrangements for rough sleepers or those at risk of rough sleeping. To help minimise the spread of Covid 19 many normal services have been closed. These include Hythe Swimming Pool, all libraries (but you can still borrow ebooks), all Household Waste Recycling Centres and all Council offices. Most schools closed from 20 March only staying open for vulnerable children and children of key workers.

Your waste and recycling collections should continue as usual. Those needing to self-isolate may wish to ask for an assisted collection where your bins are collected from and returned to your property.

Both Folkestone & Hythe District Council and Kent County Council have postponed formal Council meetings whilst we wait for the Government to allow meetings and voting to take place by video or telephone conferencing for Councillors. Lawful decisions can still be taken by cabinet members and officers under delegated powers and we were fortunate that our budgets for 2020/21 were agreed in February. There will be some delay to planning decisions that were due to go to the Planning Applications Committee but the vast majority of decisions are made by officers and only the small number of controversial applications go to Committee.

Those who can (both staff and Councillors) are working from home but many frontline staff have been redeployed from 'business as usual' to help support those in isolation and the three community hubs.

There is already a fund for council house tenants who face financial difficulties and a general scheme for those struggling to pay council tax. These are both discretionary arrangements but we may see the Government set up more formal arrangements. Keep an eye on the District Council website for news.

Director of Public Health for Kent Andrew Scott-Clark says: "I firmly believe that we should be calm and proportionate in our response. I am asking all Kent residents to keep washing their hands, be aware of personal hygiene and think carefully about the things you can do to minimise the spread, such as catching coughs and sneezes in tissues and then disposing of those tissues. **This is the best thing we can all do to slow the spread of the virus.**

"We anticipate an increase in numbers which is why our services have planned for, and are ready, for this situation. I'd like to reassure people that the risk to the general public remains low and that we continue to work with health colleagues and partners to do everything we can to stop the virus spreading and ensure the people of Kent are protected."

We have news about the Core Strategy Review which is a legal duty of your District Council to produce and covers the development needs of our area till 2037. This review was submitted to the Secretary of State for Housing, Communities and Local Government on 10 March and it will now be given an independent examination by two Planning Inspectors. If you need to contact the Council then please look online for information. Use online reporting first and email rather than ring. Please be patient with staff as they are having to cope with the same sort of challenges as everyone else. The election for Kent's Police & Crime Commissioner that was due to take place on 07 May will now be held in May 2021 so Matthew Scott will continue in post for an extra year.

Before the present advice to limit contact was introduced, we both attended a number of events in the village. Susan was at 'Coffee-N-Chat' on 18 February and we both attended Sellindge Parish Council on 10 March. Jenny undertook a Monitoring visit for Literacy at Sellindge Primary School and attended the monthly meeting of Sellindge Playing Fields. Jenny adds, "I was sorry to hear about the death of Evelyn Rossiter who for a brief period was our District Councillor. Unfortunately, I was unable to attend her funeral but my thoughts are with her family at this time."

STOUR DOWNS PARISH CHURCHES – ST MARY'S CHURCH SELLINDGE

As I set out to write this letter, thinking ahead to the joy of Easter that we will be celebrating in our Stour Downs churches in the coming month, it is hard to see an awful lot of joy around at the moment what with all the fear and uncertainty caused by the Coronavirus, and the effects of this on our freedoms, economy and indeed our health. But we do indeed look ahead to the coming celebration, the highlight of the Christian year, as we reach that joyous moment of proclaiming "He is Risen. He is Risen indeed, Alleluia!" on Easter Day. Christianity is an Easter faith, and Christians are Easter people.

The theme in the Ashford Deanery this Holy Week and Easter, is 'Living the Easter story'. Having travelled with fear, uncertainty, alienation and hostility, we arrive at the moment of hope, victory and light that the Easter story culminates in. Holy week is the story of our history in microcosm failure, separation, struggle, darkness and death, matched by the faithful and loving Creator, the self-giving grace of his Son, and the final victory of light and love. Christ is risen indeed!

When the women who had followed Jesus came to the tomb to perform one last devotion to the man they had admired and followed, everything changed as they got the message that Jesus was not there, he had risen. The twist to the story was that it was not a tragedy after all, but the greatest triumph of history. This is the Easter story of triumph that, when heard and believed, we are to go and tell.

Whatever struggles or shadows that you or those you care for are travelling through, I pray that you might find the light and hope of the Easter story – and of the Risen Jesus who himself travelled a road of apparent failure, separation, struggle, darkness and death, that we might live in the light.
