
Firstly we would like to say a sad farewell to Alison who is leaving us to go on adventures new.

The District Council has been administering the Government grants to businesses to support them during the pandemic and we know that many local businesses, organisations and village halls have benefitted from this simple process and swift payment. However, not all traders were eligible and there is now a new fund designed to help those who missed out on the first tranche of the Government's Covid-19 financial support programme. The District Council approved 22 applications totalling £185,000 in June, with a further £1m of the funding available. A further 50 applications are being assessed and we encourage any small business which has not yet applied to do so online now.

The Hythe Community Hub led by Age UK Hythe & Lyminge, continues to offer help, support and services to vulnerable residents in our villages. Please contact them on 01303 269 602. There are three Community hubs serving our district and, together with the District Council, they are considering how to adapt their services as demand decreases but we are all mindful of a possible further peak and the need to be able to scale up very quickly. We would like to thank the 637 volunteers who have supported the three hubs as well as all of you who have been good neighbours to those who've needed help during lockdown.

Every year the District Council conducts a canvass of all homes to make sure the electoral register is accurate. One difference this year is that the information on the electoral register will be cross checked against records held by the Department for Work and Pensions. The District Council will start contacting people from 01 July by email (if they have these contact details) or by post if they do not. If anything is unclear then the Electoral Services Team can be contacted at 01303 853 497 or ask one of us.

We attended both the Postling and Lyminge Parish Council meetings held on Zoom on 27 May with the Postling meeting finishing just moments before the Lyminge meeting started.

We are continuing to attend council meetings both formal and the day to day business meetings online. Residents are welcome to contact us as normal by email or phone and we look forward to being able to take part in village events in person before long.

Things can change very quickly but there are a sign of that life is beginning to return to normal for many of our services. One example of this is KCC's birth registration service which has now resumed. There's a backlog of around 3,000 births to register and Kent County Council is contacting and rebooking those who had to cancel their appointments at the start of lockdown.

All 18 of Kent's Household Waste Recycling Centres are now open 7 days a week but you need to book a slot. Demand for slots at the Folkestone Household Waste Recycling Centre remains high with 94% of slots booked by the day of use. I had a booking for 13 June and found the new system worked smoothly with enough space to keep at a safe distance. To keep both staff and visitors safe there are only four cars allowed on site at a time instead of the normal nine, the Ashford HWRC is a little less busy at 78%. Bookings can be made up to 9 days in advance but it's hoped to extend that window to 4 weeks and more slots will be added as social distancing measures are relaxed. As I write there are 23,000 slots available every week across all 18 HWRCs in Kent.

Looking ahead, KCC will be holding an online council meeting on 16 July where we will be discussing our plans for achieving net zero carbon for our buildings and services. We have already cut our carbon emissions by 45% between 2010 and 2019 and there's a lot happening in this area which has been my responsibility at KCC since last October. I'll be reporting on this in my next update.

Last month I reported on the crisis KCC faces with the numbers of Unaccompanied Asylum-Seeking Children arriving in Kent. So far this year 252 have arrived bringing the total in our care to 509. I'm pleased to report that the Government has agreed to additional funding and that other local authorities have offered to take 90 of the newcomers. This is welcome but we continue to press the Government to deal with the people trafficking behind the increase and more help in placing the UASC who now need placements.

Finally, a reminder that KentTogether is still operating to pick up any requests from those in need of support during the lockdown. It's a 24/7 service and is on www.kent.gov.uk/kenttogether or 03000 41 92 92.

You can contact it on your own behalf (no need for a referral) or on behalf of someone else. Susan Carey

Rev. Chris' Thoughts

As I write this month's letter, there is a slow emergence into a tentative return to activities we took for granted in life B.C. – *Before Corona*. In these months where life has changed in so many ways from the old normal, I wonder if the garden (for those lucky enough to have one) has been one of the ways of filling the time, a discovery of a new hobby or just finding the time to attend to it for a change. In the Rectory we have enjoyed planting and watching grow a crop of tomatoes, courgettes, a variety of root vegetables and flowers.

Tackling the garden opens our eyes to God's creativity.
