This is my final report as a District Councillor for Folkestone and Hythe representing North Downs West as I am not standing for election on 04 May. (I shall be continuing as your Kent County Councillor so you'll still be hearing from me about KCC.) Jenny Hollingsbee is standing again and her running mate is Laszlo Dudas who lives in Stelling Minnis and whose son is a Sellindge resident.

It's your District Council that is responsible for running elections and Susan Priest who is the Chief Executive of Folkestone & Hythe District Council is also the Chief Returning Officer for the area. There's an Election Team responsible for registration of all those eligible to vote, arranging the polling stations, issuing polling cards, postal and proxy votes, issuing notices of elections, overseeing the counting of votes and checking election expenses of candidates. As you would expect there's information about this and more at www.folkestone-hythe.gov.uk. The Elections Team can also be contacted on 01303 853 497. You don't need to bring your polling card with you to vote in person but from 04 May you do need to have photo ID with you. A passport, driving licence or an Older Person's Bus Pass are all fine for this purpose and you'll find a full list of acceptable documents on the council website. Those without photo ID can apply for a free of charge Voter Authority Certificate on the www.gov.uk website or through the District Council. (The deadline to do this in time for the 04 May election was the 25 April so if you are someone without photo ID do please apply in good time for future elections.)

Most European countries require some form of identification to vote and international election observers and the Electoral Commission have long called for this to be introduced. Impersonation of voters has taken place most notably in Tower Hamlets and it used to be a problem in Northern Ireland. A requirement for voter ID was introduced to Northern Ireland in 2003 which led to names disappearing from the electoral register but turnout has not been affected.

Do please use your vote. According to a recent report by the House of Commons Library the average turnout for a local election in England is just 35.9%. Yet local government can have a big impact on our lives and you are more likely to know your local councillor than your MP.

My thanks to all those who have elected and re-elected me over the years to represent you at the District Council and my best wishes to those who will be responsible to you in the future.

You may have seen reports that KCC will be overspent for the financial year of 2022/23 and wondered why the council doesn't simply stop spending, to stay within its budget as any normal household would. Unfortunately (or fortunately if you are one of the people relying on support) KCC must provide services to those who are eligible and can't put a limit on this. The worst impact has been the increased cost of residential care for older people, higher costs for school transport and the increased costs of foster placements for vulnerable children. The overspend will be met from reserves but reserves can only be used once and our auditors expect us to replenish reserves to meet emergencies not regular expenditure. The high inflation caused by the invasion of Ukraine could be classed as an emergency but for this financial year (2023/24) we will have to make savings across all areas of the council's services to avoid bankruptcy. As KCC Leader, Roger Gough says, 'we have a narrow path to tread. There are some very tough choices this year and some very big challenges for the years ahead.'

Whilst priority is given to the most vulnerable for KCC's services we are still providing services that are open to all residents. The universal service that affects us all is our 5,000 mile road network and its condition is a matter of concern to us all. Last month I reported that the Government had allocated Kent an extra £6m for pothole repair and this will be used for a programme of patching. Do keep reporting damage to the roads so that this Parish gets the right share of the repair programme. It's best to report on www.kent.gov.uk in the highways section as you can pinpoint the position on a map but you can also ring 03000 41 81 81 (remember to note the reference number in case the problem needs follow up).

The Mayor of London is pressing ahead with his proposal to expand the Ultra Low Emission Zone (ULEZ) to the outer London border, with implementation planned for August. During last year's consultation on ULEZ, KCC argued that the scheme would not be acceptable without an extension of the scrappage scheme to areas bordering London. This has not been accepted, nor has the proposal taken account of our concern about the nature of the evidence base for taking the ULEZ beyond existing Air Quality Management Areas in London. We therefore shan't be co-operating on installing warning signage on our road network until our concerns for Kent residents are addressed.

We do want drivers to move to less polluting cars and to encourage this we have been growing the network of Electric Vehicle charge points across Kent. The Government is allocating KCC more funding to accelerate this programme and I know lack of confidence about recharging can be a barrier to more people making the switch.

A reminder that there is help available for individuals and families struggling to pay bills (including council tax) and a useful place to look is on the KCC website under 'Kent Together' banner or ring 03000 41 92 92. There's also help for those who need someone to talk to. 'Release the Pressure' has trained counsellors on 0800 107 0160 or text the word KENT to 85258.

This service is available 24 hours a day seven days a week.

Congratulations to those re-elected to Sellindge Parish Council (there isn't a contested election as there were

seven nominations for nine places). I thank them for the work they do for our community and wish them and their clerk all the best for their four-year term of office.
