Mobile 07887 918 458 @jennyhollingsbe Housing Developments in Sellindge – at the Parish Council Meeting on 14 November 2023 I agreed to ask the Planning Team at the District Council if they would attend a Public Meeting to address some of the concerns of residents and to talk about the Core Strategy (Local Plan), Housing Assessment Needs, the current planning applications as well as possible future applications for the Village. The team have agreed to do this, subject to resources being available. This meeting will be planned for the New Year, probably on a Tuesday evening.

Stagecoach Route No 17 – At a recent lunch, I sat next to the Operations Director for Stagecoach and took the opportunity to discuss the No 17 bus timetable. He was quite optimistic that an evening service could be re-introduced with support of additional funding KCC received from Government. He'll keep me updated.

Otterpool Park – The District Council continues to seek a strategic partner for the project in order to bring in additional finance and to 'derisk' the Council. The current project team is undergoing restructure and a new Managing Director will be appointed shortly. As previously stated, I will be following closely as it is important that the Council do not lose control of the development, also that the original Charter is adhered to Over the last month as well as the Parish Council Meeting, I have attended the Sellindge Sports & Social Club Monthly Meeting, Sellindge Primary School Governors' Meeting and the Sellindge Surgery Patients Participation Group Meeting.

From our Ward Budgets, Elaine & I have supported the Sellindge Under 16 Football Team with £200 each and the Sellindge Bowls Club for essential electrical repairs with £475 each.

Christmas is a time to thank all volunteers and organisations in the Ward for their work and support during the year, and to wish you all a very Happy Christmas and a Prosperous New Year

F&HDC have made a successful bid and have been awarded a Safer Streets government grant of £335,546.64. The fund will be used to invest in crime prevention initiatives that focus on reducing levels of crime in the district, anti-social behaviour and violence against women and girls.

There has been a very poor take up of the Folkestone and Hythe Green Business Grant Scheme. The grant helps small businesses to save carbon, become more energy efficient in turn, to save the business money. F&HDC are continuing their progress in looking for a strategic partner for Otterpool Park. Without this extra funding the development of the project would be in jeopardy. They are only looking to enter into agreements with those partners who have a track record of facilitating development at scale, and a commitment to delivering the Council's vision for Otterpool Park.

An early Christmas present from F&HDC for you; the Free Parking in Folkestone and Hythe District will be back on the 9th, 16th and 23rd December. Plenty of time to buy those Christmas goodies!

KCC COUNCILLOR Susan Carey, Elham Valley Ward. <u>susan.carey@kent.gov.uk</u> 01303 670 561 Financial challenges continue at KCC and the County Council Network (CCN) which represents 20 county councils and 17 unitary councils in England is making the case for more funding for councils that have social care duties. CCN has also been drawing attention to the exceptional costs faced by councils for transporting children with Special Educational Needs to school. These are issues faced by all County and Unitary Councils not just KCC and, if not resolved, they will undermine the financial stability of local government. The Government's Autumn Financial statement on 22 November will set out the broad outlines of public spending but the financial settlement for each council is only announced just before Christmas. We still expect we will need to make substantial savings and more details of these will start to be published before we agree our budget for the 2024/25 financial year.

There has been no further update on the various court cases concerning Unaccompanied Asylum-Seeking Children and the situation remains that KCC is considered responsible for the care of these young people as soon as they arrive in Kent.

Turning to some good news. It was 5 years ago that KCC was first awarded a Gold Award by the Ministry of Defence for our support for veterans and reservists. A recent re-evaluation by the MoD has confirmed an award of Gold - the highest level of recognition. This makes KCC one of only two employers in Kent to achieve the gold standard two times in a row.

KCC's Country Parks have also been winning awards. Brockhill Country Park in Saltwood was named the Country Park of the Year for the sixth consecutive year and gold awards went to Lullingstone, Shorne Woods, Trosley with Pegwell Bay awarded Silver in this year's South and South East in Bloom Awards.

Storm Ciaran hit the south coast of Kent hard at the start of November. There were 100 emergency drainage problems as well as 573 emergency calls concerning fallen trees and other problems on the roads. A wind speed of 78mph was recorded near Dover. Kent Highways teams were out in this dreadful weather dealing with the problems and there have been many messages of thanks from those affected. We now face winter weather and Kent Highways gritters have already been out and will continue to run whenever road surface temperatures are predicted as falling below zero. The grit bins have been refilled across Kent and there's a map of where they are located on the KCC website. Do please report potholes on the website or to the call centre the number is 03000 41 81 81 (emergency outside office number 03000 41 91 91) and keep a note of the reference number in case the problem needs chasing.

I attended Sellindge Parish Council meeting on 14 November and support the call made there for a public meeting with the District's Planning Officers to explain what is happening with the many planning applications coming forward in Sellindge.
