Where has 2023 gone? It certainly has been a challenging year for many residents. And perhaps it is good to be reminded that there are a number of 'Cost of Living' Schemes run by the Council to support people who are struggling – see Help and support with the cost of living – Folkestone & Hythe District Council (www.folkestone-hythe.gov.uk)

Sellindge Development – as agreed at the last Parish Council I have discussed with the Head of Planning arrangements for a public meeting on Planning Matters to take place in the New Year. The Planning Team have asked for a list of topics that residents would like covered so that they can be prepared for the meeting. I await possible dates for the meeting from the team.

Rural England Prosperity Fund – just a reminder that this fund is now open and expression of interests can be made via the website <u>Rural England Prosperity Fund</u> - <u>Folkestone Works</u> I have been encouraging Village Halls and Community Centre's in North Downs West to consider applying to this fund for energy efficiency improvements, ie solar panels.

Dungeness Nuclear Industry – I put forward a motion to Full Council on 29 November to support the Nuclear Industry at Dungeness. As well as providing around 1,000 current jobs at the Nuclear sites there's a real prospect of securing more employment and carbon free energy from Small Modular Reactors at Dungeness. The Greens, Labour and LibDems amended the motion to obliterate any reference to Dungeness or Nuclear. Otterpool Park LLP— There has been no further update on seeking a strategic partner to bring in additional finance to the project. However, the leader in answering a question at full Council, said that the original charter and planning terms of reference would be adhered to. He also said that the intention was to keep control of the project! Last week, the appointment of Gary Ridgewell was announced as the new Managing Director to replace Andy Jarrett. I welcome this appointment and wish him every success in taking the project forward. I would like to record thanks to Andy for his commitment and leadership since the inception of the project and wish him well for the future.

F&HDC have made a successful bid and have been awarded a Safer Streets government grant of £335,546.64. The fund will be used to invest in crime prevention initiatives that focus on reducing levels of crime in the district, anti-social behavior and violence against women and girls.

There has been a very poor take up of the Folkestone and Hythe Green Business Grant Scheme. The grant is to help small businesses to save carbon, become more energy efficient and, in turn, to save the business money. F&HDC are continuing their progress in looking for a strategic partner for Otterpool Park. Without this extra funding the development of the project would be in jeopardy. They are only looking to enter into agreements with those partners who have a track record of facilitating development at scale, and a commitment to delivering the Council's vision for Otterpool Park.

Just a reminder, all District Councilors have a £3,000 Ward grant available to help fund local community projects. Please contact me or Jenny if you have any projects you would like help funding.

If one of your New Year's resolutions was to have a clear out then do take advantage of a new KCC scheme to recycle IT equipment – PCs, laptops, printers and mobile phones. The scheme is open to residents, businesses and organisations and is free to use. You can book a collection slot and your equipment will be wiped of data and reused where possible or recycled when not. See

If you are taking waste to one of our Household Waste Recycling Centres do, please sort what you take. Around 50% of what people bring to the HWRCs in black sacks could be recycled but this can only be done if it's put in the right bins on site. There are separate containers for metal, wood, textiles, garden waste, batteries and more. What can't be recycled is turned into energy at the Energy from Waste plant at Allington. Only asbestos is sent to landfill as it is required by law to be deep buried.

There's a new name for the Areas of Outstanding Natural Beauty and National Parks. They are both now known as National Landscapes which is an acknowledgement that both have equal status. KCC hosts the Kent Downs National Landscapes and the small team does exceptional work in helping protect the natural environment whilst supporting the rural economy. One of the projects they launched (well over a year ago) was a bid for Geopark status with UNESCO. This is a joint bid with the Parc Naturel Regional des Caps et Marais d'Opale in Northern France and is about the chalk that creates our landscape. Geopark status would raise the profile of these two areas connected by chalk and would help promote tourism in our area. There has been good news for Kent following our action against the Home Secretary in the High Court. The court has found the Home Secretary has acted unlawfully in not having proper arrangements in place for dealing with Unaccompanied Asylum-Seeking Children arriving in Kent. We now expect the Government to properly fund reception centres and make sure other councils take their share of the arrivals. This news is especially welcome as our overall financial situation is very challenging. We debate our budget for 2024/25 at the County Council meeting on 19 February.

A reminder that there is help available for Kent residents who are struggling to cope financially or mentally. The best place to start looking for help for yourself or someone you know is Kent Together. There's a link on the home page of Kent County Council at www.kent.gov.uk You'll find advice about funding available, benefits, reducing energy costs, budgeting and how to either get a referral or self-refer for help. For those who prefer the phone to the web the number is 03000 41 92 92. There's also a link to *Release the Pressure* a KCC helpline for those with mental health problems.
