Sellindge Developments – The Head of Planning and Director of Resources and Strategy have been given a list of issues residents would like covered in a presentation to a Public Meeting. This is being scheduled for the end of February, but date is yet to be agreed.

Budget – Work has continued on the 24/25 budget which will be voted on by the full Council on February 18th 2024. Whilst the District Council was left in a good financial situation when the new administration took over in May, inflationary pressures have put all Councils under financial pressure which will require increases to Council tax and fees broadly in line with inflation plus some possible cuts to nonstatutory services. Whilst I accept and support the need for some increases, I am personally opposed to proposals to cut back on street cleansing and reduction in waste bins around the District as I feel these will ultimately lead to additional costs in dealing with fly tipping and a general deterioration on the appearance of the District which was one of the top objectives of the previous administration. There is also a proposal to reduce the number of rural verge cuts from two to one during the year.

Constitution – The Leader of the Council put forward a motion to the full Council on 24 January 2024 to delay the implementation of the Committee system until May 2025. This was agreed and means that the Cabinet system of governance will continue for the next year.

Otterpool Park PLC – there has been no update on a strategic partner over the Christmas period. Other – During January, I attended the Sports & Social Club Meeting, the Sellindge Primary School Governors' Meeting and the Parish Council Meeting.

Otterpool Park is progressing well. The new Managing Director, Gary Ridgwell, has restructured the team and is making good progress in remodelling and programming the development. FH&DC and Otterpool Park LLP have been encouraged by the interest taken in the scheme by Homes England. Regular talks are now taking place with this Government agency. Prior to Christmas we received the good news from SE Rail that Westinghanger Station would become a stop on the high-speed route.

At last week's Full Council meeting it was agreed to adopt amendments to the Council Tax on empty homes premiums from 2024/25 to apply to homes empty for 1 year now instead of 2 years.

The KCC consultation on the fate of the 8 Windmills in their ownership has closed and we await the result. The Davidson Mill at Stelling Minnis is one of these and I expressed my deep concern at the potential disposal of this heritage asset (Grade 1 listed).

Work is continuing to offer a balanced budget at the February Full Council meeting. Great credit is due to the Officers and members who have worked so hard to find savings. The savings have only been achieved through a number of redundancies, the majority of which were voluntary.

KCC COUNCILLOR Susan Carey, Elham Valley Ward, susan.carey@kent.gov.uk 01303 670 561 On 19 February Kent County Council has an all-day meeting to debate and vote on our budget for the financial year 2024/25. Your council tax bill includes payments for the services delivered not just by KCC but also your District Council, Kent Police, Kent Fire & Rescue Service and your Parish Council. The KCC element is the largest proportion of your bill and covers over 300 services many of which you and your family may never need such as child adoption/fostering, the coroners' service, care for those with a Learning Disability, services to those escaping domestic abuse, mental health problems and those too poor to pay for care when they are elderly and frail. They also include services we all use such as recycling and disposal of the waste that the district councils collect from us, responsibility for roads (but not the motorways or private roads) and services that are age specific such as the bus passes for people of state pension age, nursery places, school places and school transport for those eligible. Some of the services are available to all but not everyone uses such as the 19 Household Waste Recycling Centres, 99 libraries and the Kent Archive Centre. Then there are the discretionary services which KCC is not required but has chosen to provide such as subsidies to some bus services and the Gravesend to Tilbury ferry, a 50% subsidy to the cost of the KCC Travel Saver for children in school years 7 to 11, the community warden service and the grants each KCC councillor is able to award to projects. This not a comprehensive list and even though Been at KCC nearly 20 years, I still come across work that the council does that I didn't know about before. February often sees some of the worst winter weather and damage to our roads. Do please report potholes and other problems to Kent Highways on www.kent.gov.uk in the 'report a problem' section. The interactive map is especially useful for country roads as you can mark the exact spot on the map without needing a nearby house address. You can also see if the problem has already been reported. As well as reporting via the website you can phone 03000 41 81 81 in office hours or 03000 41 91 91 for emergencies outside these hours. The call centre staff use exactly the same website map to report problems so if you can use the online system, please do so. Please also use your judgement. If something is an immediate threat to life then contact Kent Police on 999. If it's a serious road problem such as a tree fallen across the road then use the 03000 41 91 91 number. Kent Highways aim to fix dangerous faults within two hours, safety hazards within seven days, routine faults such as streetlights and potholes within 28 days. Sometimes a temporary repair is made until the weather improves or a more permanent repair can be programmed. If you use the reporting system you will be given a reference number which makes chasing progress easier. Thank you to those who reported the problems in Swan Lane and elsewhere.

I attended Sellindge Parish Council on 09 January to listen to local issues and answer questions on KCC. I was pleased to hear that Speedwatch in Sellindge is restarting with local volunteers and I look forward to joining them as I do in other parishes in my division.

STOUR DOWNS PARISH Vicar's letter -

It feels like we have only just been celebrating Christmas and the story of Jesus' birth, and this month we turn rather early in the year to the start of Lent, which is 40 days away from Easter! It seems barely time to draw breath in the church calendar, although increasingly the supermarkets go from aisles of Christmas products straight into stocking Easter eggs.

For Christians, Lent is a time to get ready for Easter and it lasts for 40 days, beginning with Ash Wednesday – which is 14th February this year.

Jesus spent 40 days fasting (going without food) in the desert, thinking, and praying about what God had sent him to do. Some Christians believe that they should give up foods, as a way of showing that they are remembering Jesus' time in the desert, spending more time praying and fasting as Jesus did.

Before Lent begins, the day before Ash Wednesday is Shrove Tuesday – or Pancake Day. In order to clear out food from their store cupboards, people used to make pancakes. One of the best ways of using up a variety of foods is to make pancakes. Then, during the time of Lent, they wouldn't eat any rich foods. Shrove Tuesday, the day before Ash Wednesday, became a day for partying and emptying pantries of anything that would not be eaten during the time of fasting. So, Shrove Tuesday became Pancake Day.

We are having a Messy Church Pancake Party on Shrove Tuesday at Brabourne School (13th February from 10:30am-12pm) for families to come along to in the school holiday.

Fasting for Lent can be very hard work. For many Christians the focus is on choosing something to go without for Lent (or take up a new positive habit!). Giving things up – or trying to – Is a real challenge to stick at. For me, it is a reminder as a disciple of Jesus I should be trying to lay down things that are not life-giving, healthy or the right way, and seeking to focus on God's way, which leads to what God wants for us: to live life like the pancake party, in abundance and joy!
