THE PAVEMENT – CONFLICT or COMMUNITY

We all like to think that we are good neighbours and, for the majority of the time we are. But there can sometimes be things that we do, or don't do, that cause problems or concerns to fellow villagers. In the October 2016 newsletter the Parish Council laid out a number of things they could not deal with. Some of these were items I thought were just common courtesy which, as good neighbours we should be trying to do/avoid in order to make village life as cohesive as possible.

So, without any idea of being a preacher, and just taking the view that, unless it is pointed out, you may not even know you are doing it, can I just suggest all residents (and their guests) note the following:

Parking on Pavements – The parking on pavements is not, at present, illegal outside of London. However, do -we need a law to tell us that if you park on a pavement so that someone using it cannot easily get by your vehicle, then this is un-neighbourly? Why should the parent with their pram and young child have to brush up against a hedge or car in order to get by? More importantly, why should they be forced out into the road, putting them and road users at risk.

Take a look at how you park and where you park. I know not everyone can park on a drive but where you can, please try to use it. Many of the roads around the village can easily take two cars passing, so is there actually a need to pop a couple of wheels onto the pavement?

Dog Mess – There is a lovely community of dog walkers in the village, the vast majority of whom clean up after their pets. There is still evidence, however, that I see on a daily basis where some less considerate owners still feel it is okay to leave their pets faeces behind. Whilst there are laws and fines in place do you actually need these? We all know the possible health implications to young children (and adults), so be that good citizen and clean up!

Overgrown Plants – What would a village be without its colourful floral displays and well-kept gardens? However, just like the parking on pavements, an out of control tree or shrub can cause numerous problems to pedestrians. Take a few minutes to be a pavement walker by your property, even try it in the dark. If you feel yourself being forced out towards the curb to get by your flora and forna, or get an eyeful of leaves, then please do something about it.

Conflicts in this world (of which there are many) have often started from the smallest of disputes and often we feel there is little we can do to change them. When, however, there is the opportunity for us all to make those little changes that make a big difference to so many, why shouldn't we do them. Let's make our local pavements not a place of conflict but a place where community can grow.

December had a very mixed month of weather. There were low temperatures at the start of the month and then above average figures on and off for the rest of the month. Rain was very light, with only 13.97mm (0.55in) and only 18.33% of an average December figure.

Our report for January was submitted prior to the Otterpool Park Community Engagement Sessions that took place in December 2016. Jenny attended 3 out of the 4 and was able to talk and listen to all views and concerns. Arcadis, the Independent Consultants, are due to report their findings on the sessions shortly which will help shape the master planning of this important Development. Further Community Engagement sessions will take place in March and will include Schools and Youth Organisations as well as other groups in the wider area. In order to influence the master plan it is really important that local residents get involved.

Continuing the theme of homes and jobs, Shepway District Council recently bought a parcel of land at Biggins Wood in Folkestone which despite having planning permission for both houses and employment use has not yet been built. It's a rundown area and in need of the boost this development will bring. Once developed, the land will generate an income for the Council and help finance our services to you.

We have been dealing with a number of planning issues in our ward and are pleased to report that the Sellindge Methodist Chapel application for conversion to two units has been refused by SDC for two reasons: the issues raised in respect of overlooking and the applicant failed to demonstrate there's no need for community use of the building. Jenny attended Carol Services at Sellindge and Stowting and the Crib Service at Stanford. She also attended the Celebration Assembly at Sellindge Primary School and Susan attended the sale to support the village hall on 07 January. We both attended Sellindge Parish Council meeting on 10 January.

Our budget for 2017/18 will be set at the council meeting on 22 February and a rise of just under 2% is proposed. This equates to around an extra 9p a week for a typical household.

The new gateway signs at the Barrow Hill entrance to Sellindge went up in December. These were funded from our ward plan project to improve the appearance of the district. The next stage of the works to improve this area is for the Parish Council to remove the old bus shelter and site a new one nearer the bus stop. We hope to help with funding for. Shepway is signed up to 'The Armed Forces Covenant' which is a promise by the nation to ensure that those who serve, those who have served, and their families are treated fairly. On 17 February there is a free 'Fun Day' at Folkestone Sports Centre which will also be informative. Jenny is the Armed Forces Champion for Shepway and she is pleased to report that we will be hosting the Kent & Medway Armed Forces Conference at the Leas Cliff Hall on 14 March. If you have an idea about work you would like to do in the local community to support the armed forces, then it may be possible to access the Armed Forces Covenant Grant Scheme. I am sure you will have all seen and heard comment in the media about the problems facing social care and its funding across the country including Kent. Many care workers are on the National Living Wage which is rising above inflation. More people are becoming old (the baby boomer generation is now retiring) and more people are living to extreme old age. Social care (adults and children) now takes up over half KCC's spending and, at a time when our Government grant is reducing and will disappear by completely 2020, this puts all our other services under great financial pressure.

The Government is allowing Councils with social care responsibilities to raise Council Tax by an extra 2% over and above the 2% referendum limit to meet the extra costs of social care. This will still not bridge the gap and, recognising this, the Government has switched some funding between Councils and KCC has been allocated an extra £4.6m for 2017/18. We believe that more can and should be done through social care to help older people live independent and healthier lives for longer and that this would relieve pressure on our hospitals. KCC is continuing to make the case for the changes to the funding of social care and the NHS that are needed for a long term solution. Our proposed Council Tax increase of just under 4% means an increase of around 68p a week for a typical household. As well as social care for the elderly, care for those with Learning Disabilities and mental health problems, KCC also has responsibility for 5,000 miles of road, winter services such as gritting and salt bins, child protection services, children's centres, the library service, youth services, the coroner's courts, trading standards, school transport, bus passes and much more.

Now for some really good news. You may remember Pfizer closing its operations in East Kent in 2011 with the threat of 2,400 job losses. Thanks to the work of KCC and Government support, the Pfizer site was reborn as The Discovery Business Park in 2012 with 150 new companies - many set up by scientists who had been working for Pfizer. Today there are 2,400 new jobs at Discovery Park.

Across Kent as a whole £55m has been given in 0% loans to 242 companies creating 2,212 jobs and safeguarding a further 1,663. Now these loans have begun to be repaid which has released £5m for small and medium sized businesses with good business plans to create or safeguard jobs in Kent. The new Kent & Medway Growth Fund was launched at Westenhanger Castle on 12 January. Westenhanger Castle was a fitting venue for the Business Fund launch as Kent Castle Ltd was one of the businesses to benefit from a £25,000 loan to grow its events business at Westenhanger Castle. There's more information about the Business Growth Fund, how to apply on the KCC website. You may also be interested in the Kent Freight Action Plan which is out for consultation till 12 March and is dominated by the problem of what to do about the damage and mess caused by HGV flyparking. It too is on the KCC website. It's your chance to have your say so please take it.

I am also pleased to report work has been programmed for the reinstatement of the verges and footpath on the A20 near Newingreen and, depending on the weather, should be complete by the end of February. The cost of the work is $\pounds 2,500$ which is being funded through my KCC member grant.

Smeeth Rectory, February 2017

Dear Friends

Those of you who visit or worship at Smeeth church may have wondered why the stable scene was still on prominent display at the end of January. The shepherds, angels and wise men were no longer there, but Mary, Joseph and the baby Jesus remained as a reminder that according to Bible accounts, the Holy Family remained in Bethlehem for six weeks after the birth. Whether or not they remained in the stable is unclear, but there are references to the wise men arriving at 'the house' where they were staying and I would consider it unlikely that the people of Bethlehem would have been so inhospitable and uncaring as to leave any family out in the cold for any length of time.

I would hope that at the end of their six weeks they would have found a suitable room, if not in the inn then at least in one of local homes.

After 2nd February, the stable and the remaining figures will be taken down and stored away until just before next Christmas as we remember Mary and Joseph leaving Bethlehem to take Jesus to the Temple in Jerusalem to be presented and dedicated to the Lord.

As Mary and Joseph looked back over the last six weeks, they must have wondered at all the spectacular and surprising things that had taken place in such a short period of time. Similarly, they must have wondered what the next six weeks, or six months, or six years would bring as they started back to their home town at Nazareth with a mixture of hope and fear.

As we celebrate the fest of Candlemas or The Presentation of Christ in the Temple on 2nd February. we have an opportunity to look back and reflect on the events and significance of Christmas and to look ahead towards Lent and Easter.

I hope that we will make this our journey as well as we look back over all that has happened over the past year and forward to all that lies ahead. Like Mary and Joseph, we may feel a mixture of hope and fear, but like them we still have the comfort and reassurance of Jesus' continuing presence in our midst. May he fill us with his grace to trust his promises and obey his will.
