

Your Council met for the last meeting of the year on December 13^{th} 2016, and those members of the public who attended stayed and enjoyed a mince pie with cream and a glass of wine or fruit juice. So by the time you read this we will be in 2017 – another year flown by! Let's hope the weather in January is kind to us.

In case there is snow and ice during January and February, do remember that there are salt bins around the village to use on the frosty roads, please do not take this for your garden paths, but instead contact the Parish Council and a bag of salt / grit can be supplied free of charge, while supplies last.

So what was on the agenda? The headline items are always the same, but the individual issues differ each month.

Planning applications in Sellindge

There was only one application to consider and that was proposed work at the old Methodist Church. The applicant has applied to change this to 2 houses. Your Parish Council have some concerns about this application, as 2 of the dormer windows will be overlooking the neighbour's patio. It was also noted that some of the work listed appears to have been started.

Correspondence

KCC Volunteer Warden – One of the letters received was to launch the Kent County Council's Volunteer Warden Scheme. Sellindge does not have a Community Warden who visits Sellindge regularly, as there have been many changes since their original launch some years ago.

KCC are now looking to see if Parish Council's would like to support the idea of volunteers doing this. Are you interested in looking after people in Sellindge for a minimum of 5 hours a week? All the training, uniform and equipment are supplied. Your Council would have to make a contribution so do let the Clerk know so that a budget for it can be considered.

WEATHER FACTS FOR NOVEMBER 2016

Minimum temp. -7.00°C Wed.30th. M Maximum temp. 15.00°C Tues.15th. M

Mean night temp. 2.72°C Mean day temp. 9.72°C

November weather was a case good and bad. Temperatures were up and down, the lowest night being Wed.30th with a reading of -7.0°C (the lowest Nov. record since 2010). On 10 nights during the month there was a frost and day temperatures were near average. On 7 days there were wind speeds in the mid 20's to high 40's mph. On the night of 19th-20th storm Angus blew in from the west causing damage along the southern counties and a maximum speed of 63.0 mph was recorded in Sellindge.

There were 15 days with rain, totalling 116.713mm (4.595in). 29.718mm (1.17in) was recorded on the night of the storm. The monthly total ended up being 19.35% above the November average.

The first round of consultation meetings about Otterpool Park started on December 8th at the Sellindge Sports and Social Club and further meetings in Hythe, Lympne and Folkestone. There will be many more such meetings and opportunities for people to get involved in shaping the project. The planning for Otterpool Park is still at a very early stage and the building of homes is not expected to start until 2020. However, some people have suggested that it would be useful to build a small number of homes to demonstrate what the standards and design will be.

On December 1st we both attended a workshop at Shepway to learn about community led housing and how it has worked in other parts of the country. It is about helping communities find ways to accept new housing and gain long term benefits from the development (as at the original garden settlement at Letchworth). We were joined by Town and Parish Councillors and heard how self build can be part of community led housing.

Our country has fewer self build homes than other parts of Europe. By cutting out the developer the houses tend to cost less and because people are choosing something to suit them the quality and design also tend to be better than 'off the shelf' new housing. Gravenhill which is a new housing development near Bicester is aiming for 1,900 self build homes. We intend to have self build options within Otterpool Park and the choices are what proportion we aim for and if we spread these plots out or set aside a particular area for them.

Self build doesn't mean you have to lay the bricks and do the plumbing yourself (although it can do). It can mean using local builders, joining with a group who have complementary skills to build a group of houses or having a 'flat pack' style house like a Huf Haus.

We have had many discussions with local people on Otterpool Park and will continue to do so and we urge local people to attend the continuing community engagement sessions in order to influence the masterplan.

We have attended many Christmas events in the North Downs West Ward and thank people for all the work they so generously give to our community. Jenny took her grandchildren to Sellindge, Stowting and Stelling Minnis Primary School Fairs. She also attended the Patients Participation Group and Sellindge Governors' Meetings. Last month, Jenny attended the funerals of Barry Corner (whose family lived and still live in Sellindge) as well as of friend who died aged 100 and our thoughts go out to their families at this time. Many more of us can expect to live to be centenarians which will lead to many changes as we adapt to the needs of so many generations sharing the same space. We've been asked by UK Power Networks to publicise their Priority Services Register for people who might need extra help if there's a power cut. Older people, families with very young children, and people with specific medical conditions are among the many people who are eligible to register for free support. Undoubtedly by the time this newsletter has reached you we will have had bad weather. Kent Highways gritters have been out on many nights since November and cover the main routes across Kent. There's plenty of advice about winter on <u>www.kent.gov.uk</u> and search for 'winter service'. You will then see if the gritters are being sent out and can even follow their progress on the gritter twitter. Kent schoolchildren named many of the individual gritting vehicles – Gritney Spears, Frosty, Snowflake, Freddie Salted being some of the more memorable names. The website also has a map of where the saltbins can be found. They are generally at trouble spots on hills or slopes and rely on road users to spread the grit as and when needed. Over the years I have used my KCC member grant to increase the number of saltbins on our local roads.

Grit needs traffic to work it into the snow which is why, even if a road has been gritted, it can still be treacherous. The gritters can also function as snow ploughs but they normally have to be set to plough a little above the road surface so they don't tear up reflecting road studs (cat's eyes) from the road. Traffic islands, speed humps and other traffic calming can also make it impossible for some stretches of road to be ploughed. Experiments have been taking place with equipment that can detect changes in the road surface so that the road can be cleared 'back to black' but we haven't yet had the weather to properly road test this. We are also grateful to the farmers who are issued with snow plough attachments for their tractors by Kent Highways so they can help keep their local roads clear. After the last really heavy snow in Kent, one such farmer described how as he cleared the road in front of him he could see the road behind him already closing under deep new snow. In such circumstances nothing will keep the road clear. Because it has been several years since we last had heavy snow there will be new drivers who've never encountered such conditions and who may not even know where to find the fog light on their dashboard. If you know a new driver

like this then please pass on some advice about being prepared (wellingtons, a shovel and a blanket are easy enough to carry in the car boot) and allowing extra time for a journey when there's snow or ice on the roads.

The Kent website also has a link to the Government's advice on snow clearance by individuals, information on the weather and advice from Public Health. Local radio usually has the most up to date information and will be briefed by KCC and all the emergency services. If there's a power cut and you don't have battery radio then remember you can always turn on the car radio.

There's a very useful booklet for Kent residents called 'What to do in an emergency' which includes information and contact details for a whole range of situations such as flooding or power cuts and I am looking at whether I can arrange a special edition for Sellindge with more local information.

Dear friends

As we start a new year some changes to the way our Churches function and work together will be apparent. Haggai was encouraging the exiled Jews to return to Jerusalem and rebuild the Temple. We will be facing an opportunity to rebuild our Benefice in 2017.

Let me try and put your minds at rest, most people feel uncomfortable with any form of change, we all like the comfortable cardigan that we have been wearing for many years. At ground level there will be little changed noticed in the way your Church works or the pattern of regular services. In the meantime I hope that you all had a very happy and peaceful Christmas. The tinsel and the decorations will soon be packed away and safely stored for next year. Rudolf and the other reindeer will be having a well-deserved rest, probably thinking about their summer holidays, so to be fully recovered by next Christmas. Santa's sleigh will have been parked up for another year, a chance for it to have its annual service.

How easy it is to set aside Rudolf, Santa and the Christmas decorations for another year. Unfortunately it is just as easy to set aside Jesus. Out He comes every year, the focus of our celebration, *'the reason for the season'*, only to be put away again like our decorations, after the celebrations - to be brought out again next year.
